I want to achieve something worthwhile in 2019, both personally and in our ministry at Gateway Rescue Mission. However, wanting without a plan is just wishing. We can wish to lose weight or get in shape till the cows come home, but until we implement a sensible diet and exercise plan, it won't happen.

In the first quarter of 2019, I plan to write twenty stories about people whose lives have been impacted through Gateway Rescue Mission. Our kitchen provides the perfect classroom for folks to get up close and personal with cooking. It's a natural growth direction for us to equip our program residents to get a job cooking after they graduate.

As for the fourth quarter, nothing. I've learned through experience that the fourth quarter at Gateway Rescue Mission is 90 miles per hour downhill with no brakes. You're hanging on for dear life and there's

no time to start something new at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Our staff will spend time planning, but not too much time. General George Patton once said, "a good plan violently executed today is better than a perfect plan executed next week." We won't wait for everything to be perfect before putting a plan into effect. There's no time like today to map out a worthwhile goal and start working energetically to make it happen.

I'm sharing this with you for a reason. Publicly stating our goals for the year creates accountability. I want you, our friends and supporters, to know our direction for 2019 and hold us accountable for making it happen. Pray that God will transform lives at Gateway Rescue Mission this year.

One thing to note. In 2019, our best laid objectives will not turn out like we planned. Life never does. However, if we don't plan, nothing new will turn out, period. Without solid plans, graduations and weddings don't take place. Houses don't get built and businesses don't succeed.

Just as we are setting goals and implementing plans for 2019 at Gateway Rescue Mission, I encourage you to plan your life for this year as well. Prayerfully commit your plans to God and trust the results to Him. Plan your year, your month, your week and your day. I pray that in doing so, 2019 will be a year when God gives increased purpose and achievement to your life.






Needs List
